- The Triglav National Park, with its remarkable landscape of snowy peaks and picturesque valleys full of wild flowers
 Crystal clear rivers with amazing narrow gorges and over 300 waterfalls and glacial lakes of remarkable purity
- The distinctive cabins of Velika Planina and Zajamniki still inhabited by shepherds in the spectacular setting of the Kamnik-Savinja Alps
- The mysterious underground world of Karst, with over 9,000 caves including the Škocjan caves classified as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, an incredible creation of nature in the beautiful underground canyon, the deepest in Europe
- Logarska Valley, a stunning glacial valley where people still live in harmony with nature
- The charming wine routes crisscrossing the hills of Gorica, Jeruzalem and Goriška Brda
- The preserved forests where it is still possible to observe the large European predators: brown bears, wolves and lynx

At almost every step you are surrounded by lush habitat, which the nature-loving Slovenians still know how to protect. Slovenia offers an invigorating breath of fresh air with a wide variety of activities throughout the year: hiking, cycling, water sports (rafting, canyoning, kayaking, canoeing), adrenaline sports (zip line, climbing), winter sports (downhill skiing, cross country skiing, snowshoeing), horse riding, mountain biking, fly fishing, wildlife viewing, panoramic flights by plane or balloon, and many more.



More than half of Slovenia is covered with green forests. Only Finland and Sweden have larger woodland areas in Europe. At the heart of the ancient woodland of Kočevje and on the Snežnik plateau it is still possible to observe brown bears in their natural environment, but you must tread very carefully.



Croatia benefits from a rich cultural heritage which is reflected in its many museums, palaces, art galleries, churches and sumptuous Mediterranean cities, where even a simple walk turns into a magical journey through history. This crescentshaped country offers a multitude of extraordinary places, seven of these are UNESCO World Heritage Sites:

- The monumental Palace of Diocletian in Split, one of the largest Roman ruins in the world
- The Basilica of Euphrasius in Poreč, decorated with spectacular mosaics
- The Cathedral of Saint James in Sibenik, the architectural jewel of the Dalmatian coast
- Dubrovnik, the most beautiful Croatian city, a veritable openair museum
- The Plitvice Lakes National Park, a natural paradise of unparalleled beauty
- The Stari Grad Plain on the island of Hvar, the best-preserved Ancient Greek landscape of the Mediterranean
- The historic town of Trogir, with the irresistible charm of its picturesque streets and beautiful stone facades

Croatia is one of the best-preserved European countries in terms of the ecology. Here, the colours of the sunny Mediterranean blend harmoniously with the calm and fresh atmosphere of mountains and the sweetness of the wheat fields on the Pannonian plain. The country of true divine inspiration, whose beauty has been immortalised by the best writers in the world, offers landscapes that are unique in Europe and in a relatively small area contains a magnificent natural heritage.

With its eight national parks, four on the mainland (Risnjak, Paklenica, Plitvice Lakes and Northern Velebit) and four in the coastal region (Kornati, Mljet, Brijuni and waterfalls of Krka), Croatia is a wonderful example of unique natural beauty.

Croatia's main asset is its coastline, one of the most diverse in the world, with 1,244 islands, only 50 of which are currently inhabited! Attracting tourists from around the world, it will amaze you with its authentic beauty, warm turquoise sea, wild beaches which still have not yet been overrun by mass tourism and for the tranquillity that exists there, as well as its immense architectural, artistic and cultural heritage. Only a few years ago Croatia was an unknown and distant country, now it is a place you really must visit!

EXPERIENCE THE DIVERSITY AND HARMONY OF CONTEMPORARY BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

Bosnia and Herzegovina has a very wide range of tours to take. The country has a wealth of stunning mountain scenery and offers direct access to wide outdoor spaces, a sense of adventure and a rich historical heritage. It forms a dual vantage point, marking the easternmost point of the West, and the westernmost point of the East. As such, it bears the imprint of two great empires, the Ottoman and the Austro-Hungarian, both of which have had inescapable influences on the culture, architecture and religion of this country at the crossroads.

Few places on earth feature an Orthodox church, a Catholic church, a mosque and a synagogue within a few minutes' walking distance of each other. This is the capital Sarajevo, the Jerusalem of Europe, where there is always something going on: choose from the many festivals (do not miss the famous Sarajevo Film Festival), or simply stroll along the alleys surrounding the Ottoman quarter of Baščaršija.

When staying in Bosnia, do not miss Jajce, the capital of Bosnia's medieval kings, an open-air museum town where the Republic of Yugoslavia was created; Mostar, the charming capital of Herzegovina, with the striking beauty of its pre-Ottoman and Ottoman ruins; and Medjugorje, the holy place where the Virgin Mary appears to believers and which has already been visited by more than five million people.



The Winter Olympics took place in Sarajevo in 1984 in Sarajevo!

The diversity is particularly clear in the religious sphere: the population of Bosnia and Herzegovina is 40% Muslim, 31% Orthodox, 15% Roman Catholic and 14% other faiths.

VALLEY OF THE PYRAMIDS WITH MAGNIFICENT BRIDGES

Bosnia's Valley of Pyramids is one of the largest complexes of pyramid structures in the world, which attracts tens of thousands of tourists every year. According to many experts, these gigantic pyramids, which are hidden inside the hills of Visoko, would be higher and even older than the pyramids of Egypt!

Among the biggest attractions of Bosnia and Herzegovina, you can also see some remarkable bridges, both in terms of their dimensions and their architectural and historical interest. Unmissable sights:

- The Old Bridge in Mostar, or Stari most, classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, has been a symbol of peace between Croats and Muslims living on the banks of the Neretva River since its reconstruction in 2004
- The bridge in Višegrad, with its elegant proportions and monumental nobility reflecting the grandeur of Ottoman architecture
- The "stone bridge" in Konjic ("Kameni Most"), declared a national monument in 2003





The charm of Bosnia and Herzegovina does not only come from its cultural contrasts and the heritage of its buildings, it also comes from the beautiful nature of wild beauty that offers a variety of activities throughout the year, including rafting and canoeing over the beautiful, emerald green rapids and skiing on the slopes of the 1984 Olympic Games in Jahorina and Bjelašnica.

This country, which is often depicted using the image of a heart placed between the mouths of two lions, has one of the two largest ancient woodlands in Europe, unmatched biodiversity, imposing mountains to climb, deep gorges to cross and wild rivers with water so pure that you can drink it right out of the palms of your hands. The most beautiful natural attractions include:

- The waterfalls of Kravica, one of the largest and most impressive waterfalls in Herzegovina
- The Lake Jablaničko region which witnessed the famous battle of Neretva in World War II
- The Sutjeska National Park including Perucica, one of the last ancient woodlands in Europe



The name "Bosnia" is derived from 'Bosana', the old Indo-European word meaning water! Many lakes, breath-taking waterfalls and abundant rivers make up for Bosnia's mere twenty kilometres of beach.



AN EXCEPTIONAL CULTURAL HERITAGE


Even though Serbia has witnessed wars, devastation, fires and migration for centuries, a rich cultural and historical legacy has continued to exist. In addition to its natural beauty, the diversity and richness of the historical monuments are an integral part of its tourist attractions.

Many archaeological sites such as Lepenski Vir, Starcevo and Vinca show evidence of prehistoric life on this soil, while various important remains of Roman roads and towns recall the presence of the Roman Empire for six centuries (the UNESCO site Gamzigrad, Sirmium and Mediana).

One of the largest collections of preserved monuments i Serbia are its Orthodox monasteries, certainly the most beautiful in the Balkans. Built between the twelfth and sixteenth centuries, their architectural features, frescoes icons and sculptural decorations embody the soul of the country and are unique treasures of the cultural and historical heritage of Serbia. Listed as UNESCO World Heritage Sites: the Old Ras complex with the Sopoćani monastery, the Studenica monastery, the Decani monastery with the Patriarchate of Peć, Gračanica Monastery and the Church of Bogorodica Ljeviška in Prizren - the last three are commonly known as the "Medieval Monuments in Kosovo" because they are on Kosovo territory, for some Autonomous Province of Kosovo, for others the Republic of Kosovo. It may be possible to spend the night in some of the magnificent monasteries of Serbia, a privileged way to discover some of their secrets!

Do not forget the other monasteries (Žiča, Ravanica, Manasija and Gradac) and churches that are worth a visit (such as the Cathedral of Saint Sava in Belgrade) and the remarkable Royal Mausoleum Oplenac, where the twentytwo members of the royal family Karadjordjevic are buried.

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VILLAGES AND OPEN-AIR MUSEUMS OF SERBIA

Serbian villages are real ecological oases, unpolluted by modern civilization, with a mild climate, clean air and natural foods. The main ingredients for the traditionally prepared dishes, always the healthier option, come from the hosts' gardens, and the passing tourists who quickly become friends can see for themselves that the vegetables and animals are produced organically.

In particular, the perfumes, sounds and flavours make the countryside more precious, more beautiful and more enjoyable than the city. From Vojvodina in the North, passing through Serbia in the West, the centre, in the East and the South, there may be many differences that appear in the details, but all across Serbia, the rhythm of life in the countryside reflects the rhythm of nature: the seasons, the transition from the working day to night of rest, the natural order of things and people.



The Empress Maria Theresa was an admirer of the traditional wines of the Serbian region of Karlovac. The "Karlovac Bernet" was even available on the wine list of the Titanic!

The beautiful coast of Montenegro

Montenegro is a destination that is soaring, with plenty of assets! Stretching over 295 km of coastline including 72 km of beaches, it is home to some remarkably well-preserved medieval towns along Montenegro's Adriatic coast, which is considered one of the great "discoveries" of tourism in recent years. The unmissable towns include:

- The islet of Sveti Stefan, built in the fifteenth century as a fishing village, has become a hotel town and the most luxurious tourist location and most photographed place in Montenegro
 Budva, the "party capital" of Montenegro, seen as the "Monte Carlo" of the Adriatic. At night, Budva is full of activities: it is a perfect place to sip cocktails, listen to live music or dance the night away
- The ancient town of Stari Bar, full of architectural wonders from the Byzantine, Venetian and Ottoman eras, offers a magical walk with stunning panoramic views of the Adriatic and the surrounding mountains

• The old walled city of Kotor and the romantic village of Perast, nestled in the spectacular bay of Kotor, move even the most demanding visitors



Brad Pitt played his first film role on the coast of Montenegro. It was the Dark side of the Sun, filmed in 1987 and directed by the Montenegrin, Božidar Nikolić. Mila Jovovic, the famous actress, has Montenegrin roots from her father who came from the country.

The oldest tree in Europe is said to be located beside the road from Bar to Ulcinj. It is an olive tree that is more than 2,000 years old! It is protected by the State and remains a great tourist attraction. At one time, the Italians offered millions of Italian lire to remove it, roots and all, and replant it in Rome, but the offer was not successful.

Though small, the country is inhabited by "giants". Montenegrins are among the tallest people in the world!

Montenegro, one of the smallest countries of the Balkans, will nevertheless surprise visitors with its wide range of landscapes and breathtaking natural settings. Deep canyons, lakes and narrow passes, national parks, mountains with dizzying summits that look down directly into the Adriatic Sea and form a jagged coastline... everything is spectacular. The fact that there are twice as many visitors in a year than the number of inhabitants of this country, who are said to be born either as shepherds or philosophers, proves that Montenegro is an excellent destination that should not be missed!

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Nature lovers should certainly not miss:

- The city of Kotor and the hill up to bastion of Saint John, where you can admire the Bay of Kotor, the masterpiece of nature, the only fiord in this part of the world and the largest natural sight in Montenegro. The landscape is truly spectacular
- Lake Skadar, the largest lake in the Balkans, home to 270 bird species, including some of the last pelicans in Europe
- Durmitor Nature Park, with its eighteen glacial lakes, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site
- The canyon of Tara, with the impressive size of its gorges, ideal for rafting enthusiasts
- Mount Lovćen, a sacred site for the Montenegrins, offering a view of Lake Skadar, the Bay of Kotor, the massif of Durmitor and the turquoise waters of the coast. At the top is the Mausoleum of Njegoš, a national hero. You have to climb 461 steps to reach it



The canyon of Tara, with its enormous 1,300 metres, is the second largest canyon in the world after Colorado! One of the features of Lake Skadar is its "cryptodepression", this means that the level of the lake is 6m below the level of the Adriatic Sea. Montenegro is number one in the world in terms of the area classified as National Parks: they represent 6% of the territory of the country.

Marvel at the great diversity of fauna and flora that Macedonia has to offer. Many rivers, valleys, waterfalls, lakes and national parks await those who love hiking and luxuriant nature. Here are some favourites:

- The Galičica National Park, with its amazing view of the lakes Ohrid and Prespa
- Lake Ohrid with its astonishingly clear waters and stunning beaches for swimming
- The mountain landscape of Mavrovo Park, ideal for hiking in summer and skiing in winter
- Matka Canyon, with its mystical nature that will fill you with invigorating energy
- Lake Doiran, containing one of the most diverse fish populations in Europe



Lake Ohrid is one of the oldest lakes in the world (also known as the fossil lake) and among the deepest (its maximum depth is 288 metres!).

"Nema problem", a very common expression among the Macedonians meaning "No problem", shows the tendency to want to settle everything peacefully and to look on the bright side of life.





BUILDINGS RELIGIOUS AND PICTURESQUE

You can visit several of the most beautiful religious monuments in the world in Macedonia. You will never forget the beauty, peace and serenity of the sacred architecture and the experience of a night spent in one of the Macedonian monasteries. The most beautiful sites include:

- The monastery of Saint John Bigorski, famous for its carved wooden iconostasis
- The church of Saint John of Kaneo, beautifully situated on a cliff above Lake Ohrid
- The beautiful monastery of Saint Naum in the surreal environment of Lake Ohrid
- The monastery of Saint Joachim Osogovski, an aesthetic complex in the middle of a verdant forest
- The Kalista monastery on the shore of Lake Ohrid, in a serene rocky environment
- Saint Sophia Cathedral Ohrid with its famous frescoes from the eleventh, twelfth and thirteenth centuries
- The painted mosque in Tetovo that looks like giant, coloured playing cards

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The Macedonian cities and their rich cultural and archaeological heritage

- The town of Ohrid, nicknamed "The Balkan Jerusalem" with its 365 churches, will charm you with its narrow cobbled streets, numerous lively outdoor cafes and its lake, so magnificent that people have nicknamed Ohrid "the Kingdom of light and water"
- Skopje, the surprising capital, dominated by the fortress "Kala". Marvel at the monumental stone bridge in the Ottoman style and shop in the biggest market of the Balkans: "Starata Skopska Tcharchia"
- Struga, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and the city of poets

Other locations and unusual events of Macedonia

- The museum on the water in the Bay of Bones is a village which has been rebuilt on the water and harbours discoveries from the Bronze Age and the Iron Age. You can go diving there, above the remains of the lake city dating from 2000 BC, a unique experience!
- The Stone City "Kuklica" with its very strange natural rock formations
- Heraclea, Roman excavations in Bitola, with dazzling mosaics, an ancient theatre and Roman baths
- The village of Galicnik, where every July you can attend a traditional wedding which lasts three days and attracts thousands of spectators



During the project "Skopje 2014" there were works and gigantic and impressive buildings built that shine in all their bright colours. This architectural and cultural project is widely controversial, with opinions divided on whether it is kitsch or urban elegance. Check it out for yourself!

The ethnic diversity of Macedonia was the inspiration for the famous "macédoine" salad, a salad of mixed, diced fruit or vegetables, popular in France, Italy, Spain and Latin America.



- The historic centres of Berat and Gjirokastra, magical cities with a turbulent past and rare examples of a typical Ottoman architectural style
- The museum city of Butrint, inhabited since prehistoric times. Enjoy the remains that tell Illyrian, Greek, Roman, Byzantine and Venetian tales!

Sites not to be missed

- The bay of Porto Palermo with its castle, located on a small peninsula and surrounded by sky-blue coloured sea. In the past, it was a submarine base: you can still see the barracks and an underground bunker of one kilometre in length
- The city of Shkodra with its mysterious castle, Rozafa According to legend, it was built by three brothers. During the night the wall collapsed and a wise old man told the brothers that he had to sacrifice someone if they wanted the walls to remain stable. The wife of the younger brother was immediately walled-up alive. She did not protest, and only begged that her breasts, eyes, hands and legs remain free so she could take care of her baby. The legend says that her milk still flows from the castle walls
- The Krujë Bazaar with its oriental and colourful atmosphere, full of all kinds of goods for sale. It is a piece of Istanbul close to the Adriatic Sea
- The second largest Roman amphitheatre in the Balkans in the port city of Durres. Built in the second century, the theatre has the capacity to accommodate up to 20,000 spectators, which is about one sixth of the population of Durres today
- Tirana, the capital of Albania, is said to make an impact on everyone. From the Historical Museum of Skanderbeg to theatres via its castles and mosques, the city of a thousand faces always has something to amaze the casual visitor


